 - o Push-on or bolt-on splices for wire mesh trays, which secure the partition to the tray mesh without compromising structural integrity .

- o Always measure and mark the bend area before cutting or attaching the partition to ensure proper alignment .
 - o Secure the partition at multiple points along the bend to prevent movement under cable load.
 - o Maintain the minimum bend radius recommended for the cables to avoid stress or damage.
 - o For ET trays, use hold-down units or TX brackets if the partition intersects with a fabricated tee or cross .
