Budget or entry-level fiber routers may provide reliable connectivity for basic tasks but may not support heavy streaming or gaming . **Security and Reliability:** Fiber routers generally offer stronger security because fiber optic cables are harder to tap than copper lines. However, routers differ in built-in security features, firmware updates, and long-term reliability .
