

Attaching cable trays

Article Overview

Attaching cable trays involves planning the route, installing supports at proper intervals, securing trays with brackets or clamps, and connecting sections with splice plates or fittings for a stable, safe system.

Step 1: Plan the Route

Before attaching any trays, mark the path where the cable tray will run, considering clearance, load capacity, and separation from other utilities. Use a laser level or chalk line to ensure straight alignment along walls, ceilings, or floors . Identify locations for bends, tees, or risers to accommodate changes in direction.

Step 2: Select Supports and Mounting Points

Choose the appropriate mounting brackets, wall arms, or ceiling struts based on tray type and load. Supports are typically spaced 1.5 to 3 meters apart, depending on the tray's weight and material . Mark the support points along the planned route and ensure the area is clear of obstructions like pipes or HVAC ducts.

Step 3: Install Supports

Secure the supports using anchor bolts, threaded rods, or other fasteners suitable for the surface (concrete, steel, or wood). Ensure each support is level and aligned to prevent sagging. For heavy loads, shorter spacing (1.5 meters) provides rigidity, while longer spacing (up to 3 meters) can save materials if the tray is strong enough .

Step 4: Attach the Cable Tray

Place the tray sections onto the supports and secure them using clamps, bolts, or quick-connect systems. Align trays carefully and maintain a level run. For metal trays, handle carefully to avoid coating damage . Ensure that trays are firmly held to prevent movement under load.

Step 5: Connect Tray Sections

Use splice plates, fish plates, or manufacturer-specific connectors to join tray sections. Bolted splice plates provide strong, reliable connections for straight runs, while L, T, or cross-shaped plates allow for corners and junctions . Tighten all fasteners securely, and ensure grounding continuity if required.

Step 6: Final Checks

- o Verify that all trays are level and properly supported.

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- o Check that the tray system can handle the total cable weight without sagging.
- o Ensure compliance with local electrical codes regarding fill ratios and spacing .
- o Inspect for sharp edges or protrusions that could damage cables. Following these steps ensures a safe, durable, and professional cable tray installation that allows for easy maintenance and future expansion.
