- o Color Coding: Different colors can indicate cable type or voltage level, improving visual recognition.
- o Placement: Labels should be visible at entry and exit points of trays, at junctions, and near equipment connections.
- o Documentation: Maintain a cable routing diagram that corresponds to the labels for reference during maintenance or audits .
