In FTTH networks, the frame can be attached to wooden poles using included screws, with the main part rotating on the pole bracket to facilitate cable winding . In network cabinets, the upper and lower sections may be integrated with cover-type, ring-type, or brush-type cable managers to protect cables from dust, reduce friction, and maintain a neat appearance .
