- o Industrial power distribution boxes: Larger enclosures for medium-voltage or high-amperage applications, often freestanding cabinets 1600-2200 mm high, 600-1800 mm wide, and 300-600 mm deep .
- o High IP-rated or weatherproof boxes: Designed for outdoor or harsh environments, dimensions may be customized to accommodate pre-wired setups and future expansion, including EV charger integration .

Key Considerations

- o Internal volume: Not just external dimensions; sufficient space is required for wire fill, splicing, and device installation .
- o Depth: Especially important when multiple wires or high-amperage circuits are present. Deeper boxes reduce overcrowding and improve safety .
- o Code compliance: NEC and IEC standards dictate minimum box volumes and spacing for safe installation .
- o Future-proofing: Consider extra space for additional circuits, smart home systems, or EV charging infrastructure .
