

Direct connection to fiber optic router

Article Overview

You cannot plug a fiber optic cable directly into a standard router; you must first connect it to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which converts the optical signal into an Ethernet signal for your router.

Required Equipment

- o Optical Network Terminal (ONT): Provided by your ISP, it converts light signals from the fiber into electrical signals your router can use .
- o Fiber optic cable: Usually single-mode with SC/APC or SC/UPC connectors .
- o Fiber-ready router: Ensure it has a WAN or SFP port compatible with fiber input .
- o Ethernet cable (Cat6a or higher): Connects the ONT to the router .
- o Power cables: For both the ONT and router.

Step-by-Step Connection

- o Install the ONT
 - o Locate the fiber wall outlet where your ISP's fiber line enters your home.
 - o Connect the fiber optic cable from the wall to the ONT's optical port, handling the connector carefully to avoid dirt or damage .
 - o Power on the ONT and wait 2-5 minutes for the status lights to stabilize .
- o Connect the ONT to the Router
 - o Use an Ethernet cable to link the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port to the router's WAN port .
 - o Power on the router and wait for the indicator lights to confirm a successful connection.
- o Verify the Connection
 - o Check the router's status lights and test internet connectivity on a device.
 - o Ensure the ONT's power and link lights are solid green, indicating proper operation .

Placement and Environment

- o Place both the ONT and router near electrical outlets and in a dry, ventilated area .
- o Use a surge protector to safeguard your equipment.
- o Keep the fiber cable straight and avoid sharp bends to prevent signal loss .

Optional Configuration

- o Check your router's WAN settings and DHCP configuration according to your ISP's instructions .
- o Update the router firmware to ensure compatibility with high-speed fiber connections. By following these

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steps, your fiber optic router will be properly connected, allowing you to enjoy high-speed, low-latency internet throughout your home or office .
