



Fiber optic cable and 220V cable run through the same cable tray

General Consideration: It is generally not recommended to run fiber optic cables in the same conduit as electrical power cables. This is due to several potential risks and complications that can arise from such an arrangement. While there are several differences, here's what you need to know about each as it relates to this discussion: **Nonconductive Optical Fiber Cables:** These are typically indoor/outdoor rated fiber cables. **Electrical Interference:** Electrical cables can produce electromagnetic. Conductive optical fiber cables shall not be permitted to occupy the same cable tray or raceway with conductors for electric light, power, Class 1, non-power-limited fire alarm, Type ITC, or

Conductive optical fiber cables with armored or metal-clad sheaths can be installed alongside electric light,



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power, and certain communication circuit conductors in the same cable tray or raceway,

Conductive optical fiber cables contained in an armored or metal-clad-type sheath and nonconductive optical fiber cables shall be permitted to occupy the same

If you want to run the fiber through the same conduit as the electrical cable, and the fiber is "ADSS" or has absolutely no metal in it, then you are totally safe.
