

Fiber optic cable directly connected to the switch's optical port

Fiber optic cables cannot connect directly to a switch's optical port without a compatible transceiver module such as an SFP or SFP+.

Understanding the Connection

Switches with optical ports (e.g., SFP, SFP+, QSFP+) require transceiver modules to convert electrical signals from the switch into optical signals for the fiber cable and vice versa. The fiber cable itself cannot transmit electrical signals directly, so a transceiver is essential for proper communication.

- o Connect the Fiber Cable: Use a duplex fiber optic cable with LC connectors (or the connector type supported by the transceiver). Connect the cable to the transceiver, ensuring the send and receive strands are correctly aligned (A to B, B to A) to maintain proper signal flow.
- o Safety and Handling: Always clean fiber ends before connecting, avoid bending cables beyond their minimum bend radius, and never look directly into the fiber or transceiver as laser light can damage your eyes.

Alternative: Direct Attach Cables (DAC)

For short distances (typically up to 10 meters), direct attach copper (DAC) cables with pre-terminated SFP connectors can be used. These cables integrate the transceiver into the cable ends, providing a low-cost, plug-and-play solution without separate transceivers.
