- o Power on devices: Turn on the ONT and router, waiting for status lights to stabilize.
- o Configure the router: Access the router's admin panel via a browser and enter ISP credentials if required .

Tips for Optimal Performance

- o Use wired connections for devices requiring maximum speed, such as gaming PCs or streaming devices.
- o Ensure your router firmware is up to date to maintain security and performance.
- o Consider LAN aggregation if your router supports it to achieve higher combined speeds.
- o Position the router centrally or use a mesh system to reduce dead zones in larger homes . By selecting a gigabit-capable router and properly connecting your fiber optic cable, you can fully leverage the speed,
