Recommended Circuit Configuration

- o Room Socket Circuits: Each room has its own circuit to isolate faults and prevent total power loss .
- o High-Power Appliance Circuits: Appliances like air conditioners, water heaters, and electric stoves should have dedicated circuits to avoid overloading .
- o Lighting Circuits: Separate circuits for lighting ensure that lights remain operational even if other circuits trip .

Circuit Breaker Types

- o 1P (Single Pole): Controls only the live wire, suitable for simple circuits .
- o 1P+N (Single Pole + Neutral): Protects both live and neutral wires .
- o 2P (Double Pole): Controls and protects both live and neutral wires, offering maximum safety .
