- o Installing conduit allows for future cable replacement without additional trenching, even when using armored cable .

Separation from Other Utilities

Fiber optic cables are non-conductive, so they can be installed near electrical lines, but most codes require a minimum separation of 12 inches or a physical barrier to prevent accidental contact during maintenance .

Special Cases

- o Urban duct routes: 12-24 inches (30-60 cm) may be sufficient if the cable is inside protective conduit .
- o Direct burial field routes: 24-36 inches (60-90 cm) is typical .



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o Road crossings or harsh mechanical environments: 36 inches (90 cm) or deeper, sometimes with concrete encasement for additional protection .
