

How to connect an SC-SC fiber optic patch cord to a router

To connect an SC fiber optic patch cord to a router, you typically plug it into the Optical Network Terminal (ONT) provided by your ISP, then link the ONT to your router via Ethernet.

- o Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN port to the router's WAN port .
- o Power on the ONT and wait for the status lights to stabilize (usually 2-5 minutes), .
- o Power on the router and confirm the connection via indicator lights or the router's admin panel .

4. Verify the Connection

- o Check that the router receives an internet signal.

 - o Keep the fiber cable straight and avoid sharp bends.
 - o Clean the SC connector with a fiber cleaning tool if needed to prevent signal degradation .
 - o Match the fiber type and connector polish with your network equipment to ensure compatibility .
