

How to set a 100 Mbps fiber optic router to 10 Mbps

Article Overview

Yes, a router can be used to limit a 100Mbps fiber optic connection to 10Mbps, either through port speed settings or Quality of Service (QoS) configuration.

Router Port Capabilities

Routers have WAN and LAN ports with specific speed limits. Many older or budget routers only support 10/100Mbps, meaning they cannot exceed 100Mbps even if your fiber plan is faster . To intentionally reduce speed to 10Mbps, you can:

- o Check the port negotiation speed in the router's admin panel. Most routers allow you to manually set the port speed to 10Mbps Full Duplex instead of auto-negotiation .
- o Use a managed switch or router with bandwidth control to cap the speed per port or per device. This is common in enterprise or advanced home routers.

Quality of Service (QoS) Settings

Many modern routers include QoS or bandwidth control features that allow you to limit the maximum speed for specific devices or the entire network:

- o Access the router's admin interface and locate QoS or Bandwidth Control.
- o Set the maximum upload and download speeds to 10Mbps for the target device or network segment.
- o Save and reboot the router to apply the changes.

Firmware and Router Type Considerations

- o Ensure your router supports manual speed settings or QoS; not all consumer routers allow precise throttling .
- o Keep the router firmware up to date to access the latest features and stability improvements .
- o If your router only supports 10/100Mbps ports, it will automatically limit speeds to 100Mbps, but you can further reduce it using QoS or port speed settings.

Practical Notes

- o Limiting speed to 10Mbps will affect all devices connected through that port or network segment.
- o For testing purposes, using a managed switch with per-port bandwidth control can provide more precise throttling without affecting other devices.
- o Always verify the speed after configuration using an internet speed test to ensure the limit is applied
