- o Outgoing Circuits: Connect the phase and neutral wires from each MCB to the respective loads, such as lighting, motors, or control devices. Ensure wires are correctly labeled for safety and maintenance .
- o Earthing: Connect the earth wire from the earth link to an earth rod or pit. Proper earthing is essential to protect the system and personnel from electric shock .
- o Verification: Use a multimeter to check all connections, verify continuity, and ensure there are no short circuits before powering on .

- o Wire Sizing: Select wire sizes according to load requirements and breaker ratings.
- o Breaker Selection: Use MCBs and RCCBs rated appropriately for the expected current and voltage.
