



Installation of Exposed Wiring Distribution Box

Site Selection and Preparation

Choose a dry, well-ventilated, and accessible location close to the main power supply to reduce power loss and facilitate maintenance. Avoid areas with high humidity, corrosive substances, or flammable materials. For outdoor installations, select a box with a high IP or NEMA rating (e.g., IP66 or NEMA 4) to ensure waterproofing and protection from sunlight and dust . The recommended installation height is 1.5-1.8 meters above the ground for easy operation and inspection .

Mounting the Box

- o Mark the mounting points on the wall or surface using a marker.
- o Drill holes of appropriate size and insert expansion bolts.
- o Place the distribution box on the surface, align with the bolts, and tighten screws firmly.
- o Ensure the box is level, stable, and free from tilting or looseness. Use a mounting bracket if necessary for additional support .

Wiring Connections

- o Turn off the main power before starting any wiring to ensure safety.
- o Prepare wires by stripping insulation to leave a suitable length of exposed conductor.
- o Connect wires to terminals: line to line, neutral to neutral, and ground to ground, following color coding standards.
- o Install circuit breakers or fuses according to the load requirements of each circuit.
- o Arrange wires neatly inside the box, securing them with cable ties and leaving space for heat dissipation. Avoid tangling or contact with sharp edges .

Grounding and Safety

- o Ensure the metal box, electrical board, and appliances inside are properly grounded.
- o Connect the protective neutral wire reliably through the terminal board.
- o Install a leakage protector for additional safety.
- o Use high-temperature resistant copper wires with cross-sectional areas suitable for the load .

Final Checks and Testing

- o Label each circuit clearly for future maintenance and troubleshooting.



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- o Perform an insulation resistance test to verify proper insulation between wiring and the box.
- o Check circuit continuity and ensure all connections meet electrical standards.
- o Only after confirming all safety checks, reconnect the power supply . Following these steps ensures a safe, reliable, and compliant installation of an exposed wiring distribution box, minimizing risks of short circuits, fire hazards, or equipment damage.
