

Installation of Level 1 Distribution Box

A Level 1 distribution box should be installed in a dry, accessible location, securely mounted, properly wired with correct grounding, and tested for safety before powering on.

Site Selection and Preparation

- o Location: Choose a dry, ventilated area away from water, flammable, explosive, or corrosive substances. Ensure easy access for maintenance and proximity to the main power supply .
- o Height: Typically install at around 1.5 meters from the floor for convenient operation .

- o Fixing the Box: Align the box with the drilled holes and secure it using expansion bolts. Ensure the box is level, stable, and not tilted .
- o Protection: For outdoor installations, use waterproof enclosures to prevent moisture ingress .

Wiring Connections

- o Incoming Lines: Typically a five-wire system: three-phase lines (A, B, C), one neutral (light blue), and one ground (yellow-green). For 220V loads, use one phase, neutral, and ground; for 380V loads, use three-phase lines plus ground, and neutral if locally controlled .
- o Outgoing Lines: Connect according to load requirements, ensuring each circuit has proper protection devices like breakers or fuses .
- o Connection Procedure: Strip insulation, connect conductors to designated terminals (line to line, neutral to neutral, ground to ground), and tighten securely. Follow color coding standards .
- o Cable Management: Arrange wires neatly, secure with cable ties, and leave space for heat dissipation .

Safety Checks and Testing

- o Power Off: Ensure the power supply is completely disconnected before starting installation. Verify with a tester .
- o Personal Protection: Wear insulating gloves, safety glasses, and non-slip shoes .
- o Insulation and Continuity Test: Use a multimeter or insulation resistance tester to verify proper insulation and circuit continuity .
- o Component Verification: Ensure breakers, fuses, and other protective devices match the load ratings .



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- o Labeling: Clearly mark each circuit for future maintenance and troubleshooting .

Final Steps

- o Recheck all connections and mounting stability.
- o Close the enclosure and reconnect the power supply.
- o Schedule regular inspections and maintenance to ensure long-term reliability .
