

Is it necessary for fiber optic cables to be routed through cable trays

Fiber optic cables do not strictly need to be run through cable trays, but using trays is a recommended best practice for protection and support.

Regulatory Perspective

According to the 2023 National Electric Code (NEC), any listed optical fiber cable is acceptable for installation in a cable tray, and there is no specific tray rating required for fiber optic cables . Nonconductive optical fiber cables can share trays or raceways with power and Class 1 circuits, while conductive fiber cables have stricter separation requirements . The NEC does not mandate that fiber optic cables must be installed in trays; they can also be installed in raceways, conduits, hangers, or ducts depending on the application .

Best Practices

Cable trays or ladder racks are widely used because they provide a convenient, safe, and efficient support system for fiber optic cables . Trays help minimize tension, crushing, and bending, which are critical to maintaining fiber integrity. When using trays:

- o Inspect routes for sharp turns, snags, or rough surfaces.
- o Avoid running fiber under or between heavier cables that could stress the fibers.
- o Secure cables to the tray at least every three feet to prevent movement and damage.
- o For vertical runs, use split wire mesh grips or other supports to prevent buckling or kinking .

Alternative Installation Methods

Fiber optic cables can also be installed:

- o In conduits or innerducts
 - o Blown through ducts with compressed air
 - o Suspended from hangers
 - o Under raised floors or above ceilings without trays, if properly supported
- The choice of method depends on the environment, cable type, and manufacturer recommendations. Following the manufacturer's installation guidelines is essential to prevent damage from excessive pulling tension, bending, or crushing .
