

Is it okay to not install a circuit breaker in the distribution box

Panels without a main breaker can pose safety risks, particularly in older homes. This can increase the risk of electrical fires or shock during maintenance. Electrical codes require a disconnecting means to be present for any panel to ensure that the power can be shut off safely. Check for proper IP/NEMA ratings and material quality. Ensure safe placement: install in dry, accessible areas with good ventilation and at appropriate height (typically ~1. Practice good wiring: secure. Finding yourself in a position where you need to turn off all the electricity in your home immediately is a rather tricky spot to be in.
