- o Breaker Types: Panels accommodate standard single-pole and double-pole breakers, with some pre-wired options including integrated RCDs for enhanced safety .

- o Mounting: Distribution boxes can be wall-mounted or floor-mounted. Wall-mounted units are most common in residential settings .
- o Wire Fill: Proper sizing must account for wire fill capacity to prevent overheating and ensure NEC compliance .
