- o Vertical Managers: Align the manager along the rack side, securing it to the vertical rails. Bend radius fingers or finger ducts should face inward to guide cables without sharp bends .
- o Optional Trays: For chassis-mounted systems like the ASR 5500, install the tray below the card cage and secure it in either the upright or lowered position to protect cables .

Step 4: Route and Secure Cables

- o Feed network cables through the designated paths in the manager, keeping power and data cables separated to reduce electromagnetic interference .
- o Maintain the minimum bend radius (typically 4 times the cable diameter for Cat6A; stricter for fiber optics) to prevent signal degradation .
- o Use hook-and-loop straps for adjustable bundling or zip ties for static installations. Avoid over-tightening to allow airflow and thermal expansion .
- o Label each cable for easy identification and future troubleshooting .

Step 5: Test and Adjust

After routing, test all connections to ensure no cables are under tension or obstructing airflow. Adjust cable positions as needed to maintain smooth operation and accessibility . For standing desks or adjustable racks, ensure cables move freely with height adjustments or sliding components .

Regularly review cable organization, especially when adding new devices. Adjust ties, trays, or channels to accommodate additional cables without creating clutter .
