

Router fiber optic cable plugged into the wall

To connect a fiber optic cable to a router through a wall, you need an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) to convert the fiber signal, then run an Ethernet cable from the ONT to your router.

Step 1: Gather Necessary Equipment

- o Avoid touching the fiber tip to prevent contamination or damage.

- o Drill a small hole if necessary, ensuring it is smooth to prevent cable damage.
- o Feed a Cat5e or higher Ethernet cable from the ONT location to the router location.
- o Use cable clips or conduit to secure the cable and prevent strain on connectors.

Step 5: Connect the ONT to the Router

- o Plug one end of the Ethernet cable into the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port.
- o Connect the other end to the router's WAN port .
- o Power on the ONT first, wait for the status lights to stabilize, then power on the router.

Step 6: Verify the Connection

- o Check the ONT lights: Power should be solid green, and the optical signal indicator should be active .
- o Confirm the router's WAN/Internet light is on.
- o Access the router's configuration page if needed to finalize settings.

Tips for Optimal Performance

- o Keep the ONT and router away from moisture and extreme temperatures.
- o Avoid bending the fiber cable sharply; maintain a gentle curve.
- o Use surge protectors to safeguard equipment.
- o If using a media converter instead of an ONT, follow the same Ethernet routing steps. By following these steps, you can safely and efficiently connect a fiber optic cable through a wall to your router, ensuring high-speed, reliable internet connectivity .
