

Safety Equipment Requirements for Fiber Optic Cable Laying

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- o Use adequate lighting and ventilation in work areas, especially for splicing and termination .
- o Avoid coiling or bending cables beyond the minimum bend radius to prevent damage .
- o For direct-buried installations, use proper figure-eight coiling techniques and avoid automated machines that may exceed tension or bend limits .

Regulatory Compliance

- o Follow local, state, and national electrical and safety codes, including OSHA standards where applicable .
- o Adhere to manufacturer specifications for cable handling, tension limits, and installation methods .
- o Ensure that only qualified personnel perform installation, splicing, and testing tasks .

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Additional Best Practices

- o Disconnect power sources before working near energized equipment .
 - o Keep food and beverages away from work areas to prevent ingestion of fiber particles .
 - o Use traffic cones or barriers when working near roads or public areas to protect both workers and the public .
 - o Maintain frequent clamping intervals for vertical installations to prevent cable sagging or long-term stress .
