Secondary Distribution Box Overview

- o Main isolation switch or breaker
- o Circuit breakers or fuses for individual circuits
- o Shunt isolation devices for sub-circuits

Secondary boxes are usually installed near clusters of electrical equipment or loads, with distances from the main distribution box typically not exceeding 30 meters . They can be indoor or outdoor, depending on the application, and may be mounted on walls, plinths, or poles .

Numbering and Labeling Practices

Number plates should follow a consistent numbering scheme to ensure clarity across the facility. Key practices include:

- o Unique identifier: Each secondary box receives a distinct number or code.
- o Circuit reference: Labels may indicate which circuits or equipment the box serves.
- o Location information: Optional details such as floor, room, or area.
- o Compliance with standards: Numbering should align with local or institutional standards, such as those used

in industrial or laboratory settings .

- o Ensure it is durable and legible, resistant to environmental conditions if outdoors.
- o Include safety symbols if required, such as voltage rating or hazard warnings.
- o Maintain documentation linking the number plate to schematics and circuit diagrams for easy reference .
