

Several types of wires in a distribution box

A distribution box contains live (phase), neutral, and earth (ground) wires, which connect to circuit breakers, bus bars, and protective devices to safely distribute electricity.

Main Types of Wires

- o **Phase (Live) Wires** These wires carry current from the main supply to individual circuits. They are typically color-coded red, brown, or black depending on regional standards. Phase wires connect to the circuit breakers inside the distribution box, which protect each circuit from overloads or short circuits .

- o **Interconnecting Wires:** Short wires that link the main switch, circuit breakers, and protective devices within the box. These are often insulated and sized according to current ratings .
- o **Control or Signal Wires:** In advanced or smart distribution boxes, additional wires may carry signals for monitoring, energy management, or automation systems .

Wire Considerations

- o **Gauge/Size:** Wires are selected based on the current load of each circuit to prevent overheating.
 - o **Insulation:** Wires are insulated with materials like PVC or XLPE to prevent short circuits and ensure safety.
 - o **Color Coding:** Standardized colors help identify the function of each wire, reducing installation errors and improving maintenance safety .
