These bridges are grown rather than built, with roots carefully guided and interwoven over decades to form strong, self-renewing structures capable of supporting dozens of people . Some of these bridges are over 500 years old and can span more than 50 meters, demonstrating a sustainable and eco-friendly approach to bridge construction in regions with heavy monsoon rainfall . This technique reflects a deep cultural and environmental integration, where human ingenuity works in harmony with nature .

Colonial-Era Engineering

During British rule, bridge construction in India underwent a significant transformation with the introduction of iron, steel, and girder-based designs . British engineers built ambitious structures such as the Attock Bridge and the Lansdowne Bridge over the Indus River, employing cantilever and suspension techniques . These bridges often carried both railways and roadways, showcasing technical innovation and the ability to span wide rivers and challenging terrain . The Fitzgerald Bridge in Pune, built in 1867, exemplifies early colonial arch bridge design, combining functionality with aesthetic appeal .

Evolution and Cultural Significance

Indian bridges evolved from practical, locally sourced materials to technologically advanced colonial structures, reflecting both environmental adaptation and socio-economic priorities.
