- o Hardware specifications: Requirements for accessories and support hardware used in helically-wrapped or lashed cable systems. This standard ensures that ADSS cables maintain dielectric integrity and optical performance when installed on overhead utility structures, without the need for metallic support elements.

Fiber Standards for ADSS Cables

ADSS cables typically use telecommunications-grade single-mode fibers, such as ITU-T G.652.D or G.657.A1, which provide low attenuation and bend-insensitive performance . For example, Corning's SMF-28(R) Ultra fiber offers improved macrobend loss performance compared to standard G.652.D fibers, enhancing reliability in aerial installations .
