- o Alcohol Wipes and Lint-Free Swabs: Remove dust, oil, and contaminants from fiber ends .

- o Compressed Air or Specialized Cleaning Pens: Ensure connectors and splices remain free of debris .

- o Safety Glasses (ANSI Z87.1 rated): Protect eyes from invisible fiber shards .

- o Gloves and Respirators: Prevent cuts and inhalation of silica dust during stripping and cleaning .

- o Insulated Handles and PPE: Required when using fusion splicers or working near electrical hazards .
